

City Council Meeting Minutes

October 5, 2020

The meeting of the Frontenac City Council, October 5, 2020, was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Fornelli. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Roll call was answered by Mayor David Fornelli, Tom Sighel, LaDonna Pyle, Marc McCully, Lynn Grant, Joe Martin and Pat Clinton. Mike Snow and David Hogard were absent.

Clinton made a motion, seconded by Sighel to approve the agenda. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Minutes from the September 21, 2020, council meeting was opened for discussion. Pyle made a motion, seconded by McCully, to approve the minutes. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Appropriation Ordinance #1776 was opened for discussion. A motion to approve Appropriation Ordinance #1776 was made by McCully, seconded by Grant. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

Zafuta and Harrison gave a high level overview regarding the process of building permits, inspections and fees. Martin asked if City Staff could generate a list of what needs to be inspected and what does not.

McCully made a motion, seconded by Martin to approve Ordinance 2020-15 Building Inspections and Permitting. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

City Administrator's Report:

Zafuta gave an update on the following:

- CDBG-CV Grant Funding Applications.
- SPARK Funding.
- Part-time Dispatcher Position Open at the Police Department.
- Codification of the City's Ordinances.

At 6:46 pm, Pyle motioned, seconded by Martin, to recess into executive session for 15 minutes to discuss attorney client privilege regarding City Services. The session included the City Council, City Attorney, City Clerk, City Administrator and the Mayor. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.

At 7:01 pm, the Council returned to regular session with no action being taken.

Council Members' Comments:

McCully asked how Court has been going since reopening to the public, Mjelde stated it has been going well and gave an overview of the different measures the City has taken to make Court as safe as possible.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Clinton, seconded by McCully. The motion was voted upon and unanimously approved by the Council.
